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CHAP. 22.

Indian agent,
duty of.

March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and sixty, and it is made the duty of said agent to see that said money is fully expended for the education of the children of said tribe; one hundred dollars for salary of their priest, provided he says mass at least twenty-four Sundays during the year with said tribe of Indians; fifty dollars for salary of their governor; thirty dollars for salary of their lieutenant governor. All the above named sums to be paid under the direction of the governor and council, also from said shore rents fifty dollars to complete the school-house on Olamon island.

Chapter 22.

Resolve in aid of repairing the road from Abbot to Greenville, in the county of Piscataquis.

Road from Abbot
to Greenville, for

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for repairing the road, where most needed, in the towns of Abbot, Monson, Shirley and Greenville, between Abbot depot and Moosehead lake, in Piscataquis county, the same to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of the county of Piscataquis.

Chapter 23.

Resolve in favor of the military and naval asylum at Bath.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of nine thousand dollars for the benefit of the military and naval asylum at Bath, the same to be expended under the direction of the governor and council.
