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## CHAP. 34.

## Chapter 34.

Resolve in favor of Eli Goss, of Portland.

Eli Goss, pension  
granted to.

*Resolved*, That a pension at the rate of four dollars per month, additional to that he now receives, be granted to Eli Goss, of Portland, from the first day of January, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventy-five, to be paid him semi-annually, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, until otherwise ordered.

## Chapter 35.

Resolve in favor of Shepard I. Higgins.

Shepard I. Hig-  
gins, to convey  
land to.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be directed to convey by deed to Shepard I. Higgins, of Mapleton plantation, county of Aroostook, the southwest quarter of sections seventy-nine and seventy, as laid down on Barnard's plan of said township, waiving all further settling duties.

## Chapter 36.

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties of the state.

County taxes.

*Resolved*, That the sums annexed to the counties in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other expenses ordered by law, to wit: Androscoggin, twenty-five thousand dollars; Aroostook, thirteen thousand five hundred dollars; Cumberland, seventy-two thousand dollars; Franklin, two thousand dollars; Hancock, eleven thousand dollars; Kennebec, thirty thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars; Knox, twenty thousand dollars; Lincoln, nine thousand dollars; Oxford, eleven thousand dollars; Penobscot, forty-two thousand dollars; Piscataquis, six thousand dollars; Sagadahoc, sixteen thousand dollars; Somerset, fifteen thousand dollars; Waldo, nineteen thousand dollars; Washington, fifteen thousand dollars; York, thirty thousand dollars.
