Chapter 50.

CHAP. 50.

Resolve providing for the payment of the expenses of the committee on military affairs.

Resolved, That there be paid to John P. Swasey, for the committee on military affairs, the sum of forty-two dollars and five cents, the same being for expenses incurred by that committee in visiting the military and naval orphan asylum at Bath.

Chapter 51.

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on reform school.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Albion Dyer the sum of forty-eight dollars and fifty cents, the same being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the reform school, January twenty-third, eighteen hundred and seventy-five.

Resolve in favor of George H. Freeman of Presque Isle.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to George H. Freeman, of Presque Isle, the south half of section number ninety-five, in Mapleton plantation, remitting further settling duties.

Resolve in favor of David Doe, of Lyndon.

Resolved, That the land agent be and hereby is authorized to convey to David Doe, of Lyndon, lot number fifty in that part of Lyndon formerly letter I, waiving all further settling duties.
