**Chapter 58.**

CHAP. 58.

Resolve in favor of the female orphan asylum, Portland.

*Resolved*, That the sum of three thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the benefit of the female orphan asylum, Portland.

Resolve in favor of Andrew Wiren, of Woodland plantation.

*Resolved*, That Andrew Wiren, of Woodland plantation, be given, by the land agent or other proper officer, a deed of lot numbered thirty-one in said plantation, further settling duties being waived.

Resolve in favor of A. F. Owens.

**Chapter 61.**

Resolve in favor of Thomas H. Getchell and Son.

*Resolved*, That the sum of two hundred ninety-nine dollars and twenty-three cents be paid out of the state treasury to Thomas H. Getchell and Son, of Bangor, for rations furnished to troops at encampment of eighteen hundred and seventy-four.
