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**CHAP. 62.****Chapter 62.**

Resolve in favor of the South Hay-stack road in Castle Hill, in Aroostook county.

South Hay-stack road, in favor of.

*Resolved,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended upon the county road running through south part of Castle Hill township, known as South Hay-stack road. And the governor and council are hereby authorized to draw a warrant on the treasurer therefor, payable to the treasurer of said plantation, when the assessors of Castle Hill plantation shall certify, under oath, that said road is completed, and said affidavit received by the governor and council.

**Chapter 63.**

Resolve appropriating two thousand dollars on Mattawamkeag bridge, in Mattawamkeag, in county of Penobscot.

Mattawamkeag bridge, appropriation for.

*Resolved,* That the legislature appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars to be expended by the land agent on the bridge over the Mattawamkeag river, in the town of Mattawamkeag, on military road.

**Chapter 64.**

Resolve in favor of Sabine F. Berry and Thaddeus C. S. Berry.

S. F. and T. C. S. Berry, to convey land to.

*Resolved,* That the land agent be hereby authorized to convey to Sabine F. Berry and Thaddeus C. S. Berry, lot numbered eleven, in township numbered five, range three, west of the east line of the state, waiving further settling duties.
