CHAP. 297.

Annual election.

SECT. 10. The clerk shall keep a record of all the doings and proceedings at the meetings of said corporation.

Duties of clerk.

SECT. 11. At the first meeting of said corporation called agreeably to the eighth section of this act, the legal voters shall vote by ballot on the question of accepting this charter, and if a majority shall vote in favor of its acceptance, then this act shall take effect, and the corporation shall then proceed to organize and choose its officers.

Acceptance of charter.

SECT. 12. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor, so far as to empower the said first meeting to be called, and if the charter shall be accepted as provided in section eleven of this act; then the same shall take and have complete effect in all its parts.

When to take effect.

Chapter 297.

An act to amend the charter of the Yearly Meeting of Friends for New England.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The third section of "an act to incorporate the Yearly Meeting of Friends for New England," passed February seventeenth, in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-five, is hereby amended by striking out the proviso, which is in the following words: "Provided, that real and personal estate held by said corporation, shall not be exempt from taxation," and said proviso is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 298.

An act in relation to the Ellsworth Police Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The police court of the city of Ellsworth, in the county of Hancock, shall be hereafter styled the Ellsworth municipal court. The present judge of said court shall continue in office until the end of the term for which he was elected. The
