Chapter 134.**CHAP. 134.**

Resolve in favor of the Female Orphan Asylum, Portland.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the benefit of the female orphan asylum, Portland.

Chapter 135.

Resolve in favor of the town of Wellington.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be, and hereby is appropriated, to be expended on that part of the road leading from Athens to Abbott village, which lies in the town of Wellington, under the direction of the county commissioners of Piscataquis county.

Town of Wellington, in favor of.

Chapter 136.

Resolve in favor of S. B. Gates.

Resolved, That when S. B. Gates shall have paid to the land agent the sum of fifty dollars, the land agent or the state treasurer be, and is hereby authorized to convey by deed to the said S. B. Gates, lot number seven in the fourth range of lots situated in the east half of township number two, range five.

Chapter 137.

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on Reform School.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Benjamin F. Sturgis the sum of twenty-nine dollars and ten cents, the same being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the reform school at Cape Elizabeth, and the industrial school at Hallowell.
