Resolve providing for the payment of Bounties on Wild Animals.

Bounties on wild animals, for payment of.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to pay twenty-six hundred and sixty dollars, from any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, in settlement of claims for state bounty for the destruction of wild animals, as follows:

Aroostook county County of Aroostook: Amity, ten dollars; Dalton, fifty dollars; Sherman, twenty-five dollars; Fort Kent, eighty-five dollars; Masardis, thirty-five dollars; Perham, five dollars; Washburn, ten dollars; Orient, twenty-five dollars; Bancroft, twenty-five dollars; Hersey, five dollars; Monticello, five dollars; Number eleven, range one plantation, twenty dollars; Ludlow, five dollars; Castle Hill, ten dollars; Blaine, ten dollars; Houlton, twenty dollars; Presque Isle, twenty-five dollars; Linneus, fifteen dollars; Island Falls, forty dollars; Westfield plantation, ten dollars; Maysville, five dollars; Chapman plantation, ten dollars; Macwahoc, five dollars; Number eighteen plantation, twenty-five dollars; Woodland plantation, five dollars.

Chapter 159.

Resolve laying a Tax on the several Counties of the State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other expenses ordered by law, to wit: Androscoggin, thirty thousand dollars; Aroostook, thirteen thousand five hundred dollars; Cumberland, seventy-one thousand eight hundred and sixty dollars; Franklin, four thousand dollars; Hancock, twelve thousand dollars; Kennebec, forty thousand dollars; Knox, eighteen thousand dollars; Lincoln, ten thousand dollars; Oxford, twelve thousand dollars; Penobscot, fifty thousand dollars; Piscataquis, six thousand dollars; Sagadahoc, sixteen thousand dollars; Somerset, thirteen thousand five hundred dollars; Waldo, eighteen thousand dollars; Washington, ten thousand dollars; York, twenty-five thousand dollars.
