CHAP. 216

Chapter 216.

An act to provide security for bonds in the State Treasury.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Bonds in state
treasury, how
endorsed.

SECT. 1. Every United States or other bond now in the state treasury, or that may hereafter come into the treasury, shall immediately be endorsed with the words following, viz : 'Property of the State of Maine not transferable by the treasurer without the consent of the governor endorsed thereon.'

Inconsistent acts
repealed.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Chapter 217.

An act additional to section six of chapter six of the Revised Statutes, relating to the taxation of property of Religious Societies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Property of
religious societies
liable to taxation.
—exceptions.

All the property of any religious society in this state, both real and personal, except its meeting-house and vestry, and the furniture therein, and all parsonages not exceeding six thousand dollars in value and from which no rent is received, shall be liable to taxation the same as other property.
