mark or marks had not arrived at their places of destination, Chap. 324 but remained back, that in such case said sale may be adjourned from time to time, until such logs or other timber shall arrive at said place of destination.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 324.

An act relating to Bridgton Centre Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. B. T. Larrabee, William S. Quincy and Samuel Parties set off Andrews, all of Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland, with from Bridgton Village Corporation. their estates, are hereby set off from the Bridgton Centre Village Corporation.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 325.

An act to set off certain roal estate from the town of Bridgton, and annex the same to the town of Harrison.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

All that portion of the home lot of land, and buildings, of Land and build-Sprague Keen, which lies in the town of Bridgton, be, and Bridgton and Bridgton and the same is, hereby set off from said town of Bridgton, and rison. annexed to the town of Harrison.
