from Cousin's island, in said town of Yarmouth.

SECT. 2. The powers of municipal officers of the town of Powers of municipal officers.  
Yarmouth, relating to said bridge, shall be the same as are  
established by law, in regard to town and private ways.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 342.

An act to amend the charter of the Camden Village Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Section two of "an act to incorporate the Act of 1867,  
sec. 2, amended.  
Camden Village Corporation," approved February fourteen,  
eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, as amended by act of  
eighteen hundred and seventy-six, is hereby further amended  
by adding thereto the following words: 'and for seating,  
and for apparatus for lighting and warming said village hall,  
the amount invested for that purpose not to exceed twelve  
hundred dollars, to be raised by assessment, or loan on a  
time not exceeding ten years, as the corporation may decide,'  
so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized and Vested powers  
and purpose.  
vested with power, at any legal meeting called for the pur-  
pose, to raise money to defray the expenses of a night watch,  
a police force, and all other necessary measures for the better  
security of life and property, and for the promotion of good  
order and quiet within its limits; for the purchase, repair  
and preservation of one or more fire engines, engine houses,  
hose, buckets, ladders, or other apparatus for the extinguish-  
ment of fires; for the construction of reservoirs and aqueducts  
to supply water; for organizing and maintaining, within the  
limits of said territory, an efficient fire department, and for  
building or assisting in building a village hall; the amount  
invested for that purpose not to exceed eight thousand  
dollars, to be raised by loan, instead of assessment, on a  
time not exceeding ten years, if said corporation shall so  
vote; and for seating, and for apparatus for lighting and —further powers.

**CHAP. 343** warming said village hall, the amount invested for that purpose not to exceed twelve hundred dollars, to be raised by assessment, or loan on a time not exceeding ten years, as the corporation may decide.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 343.

An act additional to an act, entitled "an act to supply the people of Augusta with pure water," approved March twelve, eighteen hundred and seventy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporation may  
issue bonds.

SECT. 1. The said corporation may issue its bonds for the construction, extension and improvement of its works, upon such rates and time as it may deem expedient, not exceeding in all the sum of ten thousand dollars, and secure the same by a mortgage of the franchises and property of said company.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 344.

An act to incorporate the Fifty Associates of Ellsworth.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Aurelius A. Bartlett, Charles B. Partridge, Harvard Greely, Arthur W. Greely, Hollis C. Black, Horace H. Emerson, Lewis Friend, Owen Byrn, Joseph Emerson, Albert W. Cushman, George W. Newbegin, Owen Moran, Austin H. Joy, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate under the name of the

Corporate name.

Purpose, powers  
and liabilities.

Fifty Associates of Ellsworth, for the purpose of deriving profit from the loan and use of money, and with all powers necessary for that purpose, and subject to all the liabilities imposed on corporations.
