Chapter 357.

CHAP. 357

An act additional to chapter two hundred and ninety-eight of the special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, establishing the Ellsworth Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Persons convicted of assault and battery in the Ellsworth municipal court, may be sentenced by said court to pay a fine not exceeding thirty dollars, or to be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days.

Punishment for assault and battery, in Ellsworth municipal court.

SECT. 2. All appeals from any judgment of said municipal court, shall be in order for trial at the first term of the supreme judicial court next after said appeal is taken.

Appeals, when tried.

SECT. 3. All processes from said municipal court may be under the teste of the judge thereof, and signed by the recorder thereof, and processes heretofore issued from said municipal court, so tested and signed, if otherwise legal, shall be held valid.

Processes, how tested and signed.

Chapter 358.

An act to prohibit the taking of fish from the Davis brook, sometimes called Whale's Back brook, in the town of Limington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. All persons are forbidden to take fish of any kind, in any manner, from the Davis brook, sometimes called Whale's Back brook, in the town of Limington, county of York, for the term of five years from the passage of this act.

Davis brook, for protection of fish in.

SECT. 2. Any person who violates the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for each fish taken, to be recovered on complaint, before any trial justice in said county of York, one-half to the use of the complainant, and the other half to the use of the town of Limington, aforesaid.

Penalty for violation, how recovered.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
