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PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

1877.

For what purposes, powers and liabilities shall survive.

CHAP. 372 January twenty-one, eighteen hundred and twenty; and provided, further, that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of said town shall survive for the purpose of prosecuting and defending all pending suits and causes of suits to which said town is, or may be a party, and all claims and demands subsisting in favor of or against said town, and all needful processes growing out of the same, and for the further purpose of providing for payment of any judgment which may be recovered against said town.

To apply to school districts.

The provisions of this act shall apply to any school district in said town so far as the same is applicable.

Chapter 372.

An act to amond "an act to incorporate the Lincolnville Railroad Company," approved February eighteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Act to incorporate the Lincolnville Railroad Company, amended.

That section three of "an act to incorporate the Lincolnville Railroad Company," approved February eighteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, be amended, by striking out the words "but not to the right to acquire real estate," so that said section shall read as follows:

Powers, rights and liabilities.

'SECT. 3. Said corporation may, from time to time, fix such rates of transportation for freight on their road, as they may deem expedient, and shall have all the powers and rights, and be subject to all the liabilities of similar corporations under the general laws of this state.'
