the towns of Wayne and Leeds, for the term of twenty years ; **CHAP. 388**
provided, that if the said Cunningham, his associates and Proviso.
 assigns, shall neglect, for the term of one year, to navigate
 the said pond and river by steam, this act shall be void.

SECT. 2. Said Cunningham, his associates and assigns, Powers, duties
and privileges.
 are hereby vested with all the powers, duties and privileges
 usually granted to such corporations.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 388.

An act to change the name of the town of Lyndon to Caribou.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
 in Legislature assembled*, as follows :

The name of the town of Lyndon, in Aroostook county, is Town of Lyndon,
name changed to
Caribou.
 hereby changed to Caribou.

Chapter 389.

An act to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the East Oxford Agricultural
 Society," approved February twenty-eight, in the year our Lord eighteen hundred
 and sixty-one.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
 in Legislature assembled*, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section three of an act entitled, "an act to Act amended.
 incorporate the East Oxford Agricultural Society," is hereby
 amended by adding thereto the following words, viz : 'in-
 cluding the right to assess upon and collect from its members
 such sums as are necessary, at any time, to liquidate its
 indebtedness ; *provided*, a majority of the members present
 at any regular meeting duly called for such purpose, shall so
 vote ;' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

'**SECT. 3.** This society shall have all the powers and Powers, privileges
and liabilities.
 privileges and be subject to all the liabilities and restrictions
 usually granted to and imposed upon similar societies ; in-
 cluding the right to assess upon and collect from its members
 such sums as are necessary, at any time, to liquidate its
