Resolve in favor of Benjamin Alexander.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and is hereby authorized to convey to Benjamin Alexander, lot of land numbered fifty-three, in township number five, range three, now Oakfield plantation, waiving further settling duties.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized to convey, by deed, to S. W. Stratton, lot numbered ten, section thirteen, in the town of Washburn, on payment of thirty-five cents per acre, in cash.
