#### Chapter 234.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin R. Walker and Joseph C. Walker.

Benj. R. and Joseph C. Walker, in favor of. Resolved, That the land agent be, and he is hereby authorized to convey to Benjamin R. Walker and Joseph C. Walker, lot numbered twenty-two, in township numbered four, in the fourth range, west from the east line of the state, in the county of Aroostook, now town of Island Falls, waiving all further settling duties.

Approved February 7, 1877.

#### Chapter 235.

Resolve providing for the payment of the oxpenses of the Committee on Military
Affairs.

Committee on military affairs payment of expenses of. Resolved, That there be paid John L. Browne, for the Committee on Military Affairs, the sum of thirty-nine dollars and seventy-five cents, the same being for expenses incurred by that committee, in visiting the Military and Naval Asylum, at Bath.

Approved February 7, 1877.

#### Chapter 236.

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture.

Committee on agriculture, in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to the Chairman of the Committee on Agriculture, the sum of sixty-four dollars and thirty-nine cents, in payment of expenses of said committee in visiting the College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts, pursuant to an order of the legislature.
