Chapter 241.**CHAP. 241**

Resolve providing clothing for the Portland Montgomery Guards.

Resolved, That the sum of thirteen hundred dollars be and is hereby appropriated for uniforming the Portland Montgomery Guards, as contemplated by the act approved February fifteen, eighteen hundred and seventy-six.

Portland Montgomery Guards, appropriation for uniforming.

Approved February 7, 1877.

Chapter 242.

Resolve in favor of the Plantation of Wallagrass.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated to aid in the construction of a bridge over Wallagrass stream, in the plantation of Wallagrass, in the county of Aroostook; the same to be paid out of the state treasury, to the treasurer of Wallagrass, when the county commissioners of Aroostook shall have certified that a good and substantial bridge has been built over said stream.

Wallagrass plantation, in favor of.

Approved February 7, 1877.

Chapter 243.

Resolve in favor of Saint Francis plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated to aid in the construction of a bridge over Hunnewell brook, in the plantation of Saint Francis, in the county of Aroostook; the same to be paid out of the state treasury, to the treasurer of Saint Francis, when the county commissioners of Aroostook shall have certified that a good bridge has been built over said brook.

St. Francis plantation, in favor of.
