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RESOLVES

OF THE

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CHAP. 256**Chapter 256.**

Resolve laying a Tax on the several counties of the state.

County taxes.

*Resolved*, That the sums annexed to the counties in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other expenses ordered by law, to wit: Androscoggin, thirty-three thousand dollars; Aroostook, fourteen thousand five hundred dollars; Cumberland, eighty-two thousand dollars; Franklin, seven thousand dollars; Hancock, fifteen thousand dollars; Knox, twenty thousand dollars; Kennebec, thirty-six thousand dollars; Lincoln, nine thousand dollars; Oxford, twelve thousand dollars; Penobscot, sixty thousand dollars; Piscataquis, six thousand dollars; Sagadahoc, sixteen thousand dollars; Somerset, twelve thousand dollars; Washington, twenty thousand dollars; Waldo, eighteen thousand dollars; York, twenty-five thousand dollars.

**Chapter 257.**

Resolve in favor of the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Agent Penobscot  
Indians, in favor  
of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, or so much thereof as shall be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated to defray the expenses of a Canadian Indian who has fallen into distress among the Penobscot tribe of Indians; said sum to be paid to the agent of the Penobscot Indians, after the governor and council have audited the bills.

**Chapter 258.**

Resolve in favor of the Maine State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts.

Maine state col-  
lege, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of fifteen thousand two hundred and eighteen dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purpose of paying existing debts for instruction, building farm house, and contingent expenses of the Maine

state college of agriculture and the mechanic arts, the same CHAP. 259  
to be in full for any and all expenditures by the state, on  
account of said college, for the current year.

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### Chapter 259.

Resolve in favor of Charles W. Porter.

*Resolved*, That when Charles W. Porter shall have shown  
to the land agent that he is the lawful holder of the land  
certificate of lot number ninety-five, in township I, range  
two, west from the east line of the state, and shall have paid  
the balance of road labor due on said lot, at the rate of fifty  
cents per acre, the land agent be and he is hereby authorized  
to convey to him said lot, waiving all further settling duties.

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### Chapter 260.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey certain lots of land in townships num-  
bered four and five, range thirteen, in the county of Piscataquis.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be, and he is hereby author-  
ized to convey to the lawful holders of the land certificates of  
lots numbered two, three and four, in section four in town-  
ship numbered four, range thirteen, and lots G, H and I, in  
township numbered five, range thirteen, west from the east  
line of the state, in the county of Piscataquis, for thirty-five  
cents per acre in cash, in addition to road labor already per-  
formed in part or in full payment for said lots, waiving all  
further settling duties.
