Chapter 271.

CHAP. 271

Resolve in favor of the town of Anson.

WHEREAS, The judicial reports, acts and resolves, and other official documents furnished said town by provision of law, were destroyed by a destructive fire in said town, on the nineteenth day of June, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, therefore,

Town of Anson,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the state librarian be authorized and instructed to furnish said town with said documents, or such of them as may be in his possession, and can be spared from the state library.

Chapter 272.

Resolve in favor of bridge in the town of Lyndon.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars be appropriated in aid of the construction of a bridge over the Aroostook river, at Caribou village, in the town of Lyndon, to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Aroostook county, *provided, however*, that not more than one-third part of the actual cost of said bridge shall be paid from the sum appropriated by this resolve, and to be paid when the bridge is completed.

Chapter 273.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Resolved, That the sum of four thousand and five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the use of the Maine industrial school for girls, at Hallowell, to meet the current expenses of the ensuing year, the same to be expended by the trustees of said school.
