and by adding after the word "so," in the fourth line, the words 'cut down, defaced, destroyed, or,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 11. If any persons enters on any grass land, dooryard, ornamental grounds, orchard or garden, and cuts down, defaces, destroys, or takes therefrom, without permission of the owner, any grass, hay, fruit, vegetable, ornamental tree or shrub, he shall be liable to the party injured in a sum equal to three times the value of the articles so cut down, defaced, destroyed, or taken away, in an action of trespass.'

Penalty for trespass upon improved or ornamental grounds.

Approved February 9, 1878.

Chapter 19.

An act amendatory of "an act to provide for the organization of Business Corporations."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The act approved February second, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, providing for the organization of business corporations, is and shall be construed to include corporations whose purpose is the carriage of passengers or freight, or both, upon the high seas, or from port or ports in this state to a foreign port or ports, or to a port or ports in other states ; and to include all corporations whose purpose is the carriage of freight or passengers, or both, upon any waters whatever where such corporations may legally navigate.

Act for organization of business corporations, to include corporations who purpose carriage of freight or passengers upon navigable waters.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
