Chapter 13.

An act to incorporate the Cumberland Club of Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Bion Bradbury, Horace Anderson, Charles F. Corporators. Libby, William Henry Anderson, Seth C. Gordon, John Marshall Brown, and all persons who are or may hereafter become associated with them, are hereby created a corporation by name of Cumberland Club, for the purpose of Corporate name and purpose. establishing and maintaining a club house in the city of Portland, in this state, and of promoting literary and social intercourse among its members; and by that name shall have power to sue and be sued, and possess all the rights and privileges of corporations under the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may elect such officers as it powers and may deem necessary, and may take, hold and convey real and personal property to an amount not exceeding seventy-five thousand dollars, and may adopt such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they may deem necessary for the management of their affairs, including the power to fix and limit the right of members in and to the corporate property, and the manner in which the same shall determine.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of the corporators may be First meeting, called by any one of the persons named in the first section of this act, by giving seven days' notice of the time and place of said meeting, by publishing the same in any daily paper in said Portland.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 14.

An act to authorize the Portland and Ogdonsburg Railroad Company to issue Preferred Stock, and for other purposos.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. For the purpose of relieving itself from its in- P. & O. R. R. Co. authorized to debtedness, the Portland and Ogdensburg Railroad Company issue preferred is hereby authorized to issue stock to an amount not exceeding
