Chap. 65. or act shall be construed as affecting, by implication or otherwise, any question as to whether such rights, or any of them, exist, or any question of their nature or ownership.

Approved February 15, 1878.

Chapter 65.

An act to prohibit the taking of Fish from Field's pond, in the town of Orrington, and from Brewer's pond, in the towns of Orrington and Bucksport.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking fish from certain waters, except with hook and line, prohibited. SECT. 1. All persons are forbidden to take fish of any kind from Field's pond, in the town of Orrington, and from Brewer's pond, in the towns of Orrington and Bucksport, in the counties of Penobscot and Hancock, except with a single hook and line.

Penalty for violation, how recovered. SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for each fish taken, to be recovered, on complaint, before any trial justice in said counties, or before any court having jurisdiction in the case, one-half to the use of the complainant, and one-half to the use of the town in which the offense is committed.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 66.

An act to prevent the throwing of refuse into the tributaries of Wilson pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Throwing refuse into certain water, prohibited.

SECT. 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner of mills on the streams of water flowing into Wilson pond, in the city of Auburn, or any person or persons employed in or about said mills, to east or throw any shavings, sawdust or other rubbish into the waters of said streams, or allow the same to be deposited in such a manner that it may be washed therein.

Penalty for violation, how recovered.

SECT. 2. If any person or persons shall violate the provisions of section one of this act, he or they shall be subject

to a fine or penalty of not more than fifty dollars, nor less Chap. 67. than ten dollars, upon complaint and conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction.

Chapter 67.

An act to amend an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Sandy River Valley Railroad Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifteen, chapter forty-nine of the private and special laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, is hereby amended, by striking out the word "seventy-five," in the fifth line, and inserting therein the word 'eighty-one,' and by striking out the word "eighty-two," in the eighth line, and inserting therein the word 'eighty-eight,' so that the same shall read, when amended, as follows:

If the said corporation shall not have been organization and organized, and the location, according to actual survey of the location to be made Dec. 31, 1881. route, filed with the county commissioners of the county in which the same shall be located, on or before the thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, or if the said corporation shall fail to complete said railroad on or before the first day of January, Road to be comin the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and 1888. eighty-eight, then in either of the above mentioned cases this act shall be null and void as to all that part of said railroad not completed and finished on or before the date last above named.

Chapter 68.

An act to incorporate the Springvale Aqueduct Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

John A. Dennett, Moses Dennett, Stephen M. Corporators. Herson and Samuel D. Tibbetts, their associates and assigns,
