CHAP. 84. in the city of Augusta, at least one week prior to the time fixed for the meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved February 21, 1878.

Chapter 84.

An act to regulate the disbursement of public funds by the Treasurer of Cumberland county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Orders of county commissioners to be accompanied by vouchers.

SECT. 1. No money shall be paid out by the treasurer of Cumberland county on the order of the county commissioners, unless the original bill or bills are presented with the order, and said bill or bills, after being paid, shall be filed in the treasurer's office, and shall be open for public inspection.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 85.

An act to provide schools for the training of Teachers in Madawaska Territory.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Trustees of normal schools authorized to establish training schools.

SECT. 1. The trustees of the normal schools are hereby authorized to establish and maintain, for a period not less than six months in each year, two schools in Madawaska territory, so called, for the purpose of training persons to teach in the common schools of said territory. The towns in which such schools may be located, shall furnish suitable buildings therefor, free of expense, and shall also furnish fuel for said schools. The choice of books and teachers for said schools, the course of study to be pursued therein, and the grade of scholarship for admission thereto, shall be under the control of said trustees.
