Resolve relating to Temperance.

WHEREAS, the use of alcoholic liquors as a beverage has a direct tendency to destroy domestic happiness, corrupt society, encourage crime, and drag men down to poverty, pauperism, degradation and ruin, therefore,

Resolved, That the noble men and women of the State of Maine, who have so faithfully and earnestly labored to suppress the evils of intemperance, and to reform and elevate the inebriate, are entitled to, and should receive the commendation and the energetic support of all good people within our borders.

Chapter 10.

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on Reform School.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state is hereby authorized and directed to pay P. Tolman, chairman of the joint standing committee on reform school, the sum of sixty-one dollars, the same being for expenses incurred by the committee visiting the reform school at Cape Elizabeth and the industrial school at Hallowell.

Resolve in favor of Lincoln E. Sprague.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey unto Lincoln E. Sprague, lot number ninety-four, in township thirteen, range three, in Aroostook county, upon payment by him of the amount due thereon, and satisfactory proof that he is the rightful owner of the same.
