Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on Financial Affairs.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to James Bailey, the sum of seventy-one dollars and fifty cents, it being for expenses incurred by the committee on financial affairs, in visiting the Maine general hospital by order of the legislature.

Chapter 26.

Resolve in favor of Shepard I. Higgins.

Shepard I.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Shepard I. Higgins, lot number five, in township number eleven, range three, west from the east line of the state, on receiving, in addition to the road labor already paid, twenty cents per acre in cash, and satisfactory evidence that said Higgins is the lawful holder of the certificate of said lot.

Chapter 27.

Resolve in favor of Charles F. Collins.

Charles F. Col-
lins, in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Charles F. Collins, lot number thirty-eight, in township L, range two, and also lot number twenty-four, in township number eleven, range three, Aroostook county, on payment by said Collins, in addition to the road labor already paid, of twenty cents per acre in cash, and proving that he is the lawful owner of the land certificates of said lots.
