Chapter 63.

CHAP. 63.

Resolve in favor of S. W. Stratton.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to S. W. Stratton, lot number ten, in section thirteen, in township number thirteen, range three, west from the east line of the state, waiving settling duties.

S. W. Stratton, in favor of.

Approved February 19, 1878.

Chapter 64.

Resolve relating to Perham Plantation.

Resolved, That the governor and council be instructed, as soon as may be, to cause such proceedings to be had as will lead to an adjudication or settlement of the legal rights of the parties, including the state, interested in the soil and timber respectively, of the lands in Perham plantation.

Perham plantation, in favor of.

Approved February 19, 1878.

Chapter 65.

Resolve in favor of the Shapleigh and Acton Agricultural Society.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, to the treasurer of the Shapleigh and Acton agricultural society, the sum of one hundred and two dollars and ten cents, this being the balance due for the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two.

Chapter 66.

Resolve in favor William D. Orr.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to William D. Orr, the north half of lot number seventy-three, in township number four, range four, west from the east line of the state, waiving settling duties.

William D. Orr, in favor of.
