#### Chapter 165.

An Act to amend chapter ten of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section five of chapter ten of the public laws of Sec. 5, ch. 10, public laws eighteen hundred and seventy-eight is hereby amended by insert- 1878, amended. ing after the word "justices" in the third line thereof the words 'including all actions of forcible entry and detainer' and by adding to said section the following, to wit: 'and libels for divorce; and of all civil actions at law where the damages exceed one thousand dollars, except complaints for flowage, real actions and actions of trespass quare clausum.'

SECT. 2. Section one of chapter forty-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five" and "twenty-seven" in the tenth line thereof, and inserting in the ninth line thereof after the word "thirteen" the word 'and; provided that this section shall not apply to indictments now pending in the supreme judicial Not to apply to pending indictcourt.
