Chapter 227.**CHAP. 227**

An act to repeal an act approved March nine, eighteen hundred and eighty, and to restore chapter twenty-nine of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled "An Act to encourage the development of the mining interests of the state."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The act to repeal chapter twenty-nine of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, relating to the mining interests of the state, approved March nine, eighteen hundred and eighty, is hereby repealed, and chapter twenty-nine of the public laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, is hereby revived and continued in force.

Ch. 29, public laws of 1878 revived.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 228.

An act to amend section forty-nine, chapter twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section forty-nine of chapter twenty-seven of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty-five of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, is hereby amended by inserting in the sixteenth line, between the words "correction" and "not," the words 'and to labor,' also by inserting after the word "imprisonment," the words 'and to labor,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows :

Sec. 49, ch. 27, R. S., as amended by ch. 255, public laws of 1874, amended.

'SECT. 49. Any person hereafter found intoxicated in any of the streets or highways, or being intoxicated in his own house, or in any other building or place, who shall become quarrelsome, or in any other way disturb the public peace, or that of his own or any other family, so as to render it necessary for the police or peace officers to interfere, may be taken into custody by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, constable, marshal, deputy marshal, police officer or watchman, and committed to the watch house or restrained in some other suitable place, till a complaint can be made and warrant issued in due form, upon which he may be arrested and tried,
