Chap. 246 the first day of October, till the first day of June following, in each year.

Penalty for vio-

SECT. 2. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this act, shall be fined ten dollars, and costs of prosecution.

Approved February 28, 1880.

Chapter 246.

An act to amend acts relating to a Municipal Court for the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Part of ch. 177, special laws 1872, repealed. SECT. 1. Specification ten of chapter one hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-two is hereby repealed.

Sec. 1, ch. 636, special laws 1871, amended. SECT. 2. Section one of chapter six hundred and thirty-six of the private and special laws of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one, establishing a municipal court for the city of Lewiston, is hereby amended, by striking out all of said section after the word "city," in the seventh line, and inserting in its stead the following: 'in monthly payments, an annual salary of one thousand dollars, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to his office,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Municipal court established.

'SECT. 1. A municipal court is hereby established for the city of Lewiston, which shall be a court of record, and have a seal, and shall consist of one judge, who shall be a member of the bar in Androscoggin county, who shall be appointed, elected, qualified and hold his office as provided in the constitution, who shall reside, during his continuance in office, in said city of Lewiston, and who shall receive from said city, in monthly payments, an annual salary of one thousand dollars, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to his office.'

Appointment and compensation of judge.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on the fifteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Approved March 4, 1880.
