Chapter 5.**CHAP. 5.**

An act to amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Ocean Street Railroad Company," approved March four, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The act entitled "An act to incorporate the Ocean Street Railroad Company," approved March four, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty, is hereby amended by striking out the word "fifty," in the eleventh line of section seven of said act, and inserting the word 'twenty-five' in place of said word "fifty," so that the said section when amended shall read as follows :

Sec. 7, ch. 249,
special laws 1880,
amended.

'SECT. 7. Said capital stock shall be divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 6.

An act to authorize the sale of the Old Baptist Meeting-House in Mount Vernon.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The pew-holders of the old Baptist meeting-house, situated in the town of Mount Vernon, on the road leading from Mount Vernon village to Readfield, and near the dwelling-house of B. C. Robinson, are hereby empowered to sell and convey all the interest of said pew-holders in said house and lot, both real and personal.

Pew-holders au-
thorized to con-
vey their interest.

SECT. 2. Joseph Hopkins, Joseph Blake, Elisha C. Carson, or either of them, are hereby authorized and empowered to call a meeting of said pew-holders at the said meeting-house. Said meeting is hereby authorized to appoint a suitable person or persons to sell and convey the property in said house and lot, at public or private sale, as said meeting shall determine. Notice of said meeting shall be posted up in two public and conspicuous places in said town of Mount Vernon, and on the outer door of said meeting-house, two weeks at least before said meeting.

Meeting may be
called and sale
authorized.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
