Chapter 46.

CHAP. 46.

An act to repeal chapter one hundred and ten of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six, relating to the preservation of pickerel in Winthrop Ponds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That chapter one hundred and ten of the special Ch. 110, special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six be, and is hereby penled. repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 47.

An act to incorporate the Lewiston Steam Heating Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said company shall be capital stock. twenty thousand dollars, subject to be increased to any further amount at any time, and from time to time, not exceeding in the whole, seven hundred thousand dollars, and shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

not repugnant to the laws of this state.
