Chapter 93.

An act to repeal chapter four hundred and fifty-three of the Private and Special Law^s of eighteen hundred and sixty-five, entitled "An act to increase the tells of the Baskahegan Dam Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Ch. 453, special laws 1865, repealed. Chapter four hundred and fifty-three of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-five, entitled "An act to increase the tolls of the Baskahegan Dam Company," approved February four, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 94.

An act to incorporate the Skowhogan and Athens Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

·Corporators.

Sect. 1. J. S. Tobey, F. G. Greene, Edward Ware, S. L. Tobey, O. W. McIntire, Albert Leavitt, P. F. Hurd, F. A. Hight, C. F. Dore, J. W. Bixby, M. B. Smiley, L. T. Pike, J. C. Kinsman, B. F. Eaton, A. S. C. Hall, D. F. Hobart, Reuben Hussey, J. W. Hussey, J. F. Holman, E. S. Dutton, O. L. Bush, A. C. Wade, J. H. Hight, B. M. Hight, Tom H. Howard, Henry Leavitt, and their associates are hereby created a body corporate, by the name of the Skowhegan and Athens Railroad Company, with all the powers, rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties, obligations and restrictions conferred and imposed by the laws of the state.

Corporate name.

Authorized to locate, construct and operate railroad.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to locate, construct, maintain and operate a railroad of a gauge not exceeding three feet and not less than two feet, from some point in Skowhegan village, through East Madison Lower Mills in the town of Madison, and through the town of Cornville to Athens village, with the right to connect with the Maine Central Railroad in Skowhegan.
