Chapter 16.

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on State Prison.

Committee on state prison, in favor of. Resolved, That the treasurer of state be directed to pay to George D. Bisbee, chairman of the joint standing committee on state prison, one hundred and fifty-one dollars and twenty-five cents, the same being the amount paid by him for expenses of the joint standing committee on state prison while on its recent visit to that institution in accordance with the order of the legislature.

Approved February 26, 1881.

Chapter 17.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin M. Nutter.

Benj. M. Nutter, in favor of Resolved, That the sum of eight dollars per month, for one year, be paid Benjamin M. Nutter, late of company G, thirteenth Maine volunteers. Said amount to be taken from the pension fund of this state, appropriated by the legislature for like cases.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor Almira E. Cobb.

Almira E. Cobb, in favor of. Resolved, That the pension of Almira E. Cobb, of Lee, be continued two years from the sixteenth day of May next.
