CHAP. 56.

Chapter 56.

Resolve in relation to Invitation to the President of the United States, to visit the State of Maine.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, An organization of the soldiers and sailors of the State of Maine, who participated in the recent war of the rebellion, have concluded to have a general re-union of the veterans of Maine, on some day in August next, or thereabouts, and have through their president, General Joshua L. Chamberlain, extended an invitation to James A. Garfield, President of the United States, to be present as a guest during the exercises of so interesting an occasion. Therefore,

Governor and council requested to extend courtesies to the president.

Resolved, That his excellency, Harris M. Plaisted, governor of the state, and his executive council, be requested to extend to the President of the United States such attention and courtesies as his presence in the state on such an occasion should demand.

Chapter 57.

Resolve in regard to settlers' lots in township number seventeen, range seven, now Wallagrass plantation.

Land agent to ascertain who are the lawful claimants to certain lots in Wallagrass

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby directed to investigate, by himself or by some one by him appointed, who are the present and lawful claimants of the settlers lots in township number seventeen, range seven, now Wallagrass plantation, to wit: lots numbered two, ten, thirteen, fifteen, seventeen, twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-six, twenty-seven, thirty, thirty-one, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-eight, forty-seven, forty-eight, forty-nine, and one-half of twenty-four; and when so ascertained, he shall deed said claimants the whole or parts of lots, as the case may be, by quit-claim, conveying all the right, title and interest which the state of Maine received from the commonwealth of Massachusetts, by deed, dated February twenty-five, eighteen hundred and eighty-one, as now on file in the land office; and if any other lot or lots, not numbered or mentioned in this resolve, in said plantation, the said land agent is also empowered to ascertain the claimant, and deed the same, as provided for the lots named in this resolve; *provided, however*, that this resolve
