## CHAP. 176

## Chapter 176.

An Act to authorize the Pejepsicot Water Company to purchase and own real and personal estate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Sec. 2, ch. 109,  
special laws of  
1881, amended.

Section two of chapter one hundred and nine of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-one, is hereby amended by striking out from the second line thereof the words, "necessary and convenient for the purposes aforesaid," and by inserting instead thereof, the words, 'for any purposes as a natural person may do,' so that the same section amended, shall be as follows :

Pejepsicot Water  
Co. authorized to  
hold property  
same as a natural  
person.

'SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and personal estate for any purposes as a natural person may do, not exceeding in amount, five hundred thousand dollars.'

## Chapter 177.

An Act to legalize the doings of the town of North Haven.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Doings of town of  
North Haven,  
legalized.

SECT. 1. The doings of the inhabitants of the town of North Haven, in the county of Knox, at a town meeting held July ten, eighteen hundred and eighty-two, in voting money to build a bridge across tide waters at Pulpit Harbor are hereby made legal and valid ; and said town is hereby authorized to maintain said bridge in repair ; said bridge to have a good and sufficient draw of the width of twenty-two feet for the passage of vessels.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
