Certain acts repealed.

Sect. 8. So much of sections twenty-two, twenty-four and twenty-five of chapter forty of the revised statutes as relates to lobsters, and sections nineteen, twenty and twenty-one of the same chapter, as amended by chapter two hundred seventy-five of the public laws of eighteen hundred eighty-five, are hereby repealed.

When act shall take effect.

SECT. 9. This act shall take effect July one, eighteen hundred eighty-seven.

#### Chapter 145.

An Act to authorize towns to hold money for Cemetery purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Cities and towns may hold money in trust for cemetery purposes. SECT. 1. Any person owning or interested in a lot in a public burial place of a city or town, may deposit with the treasurer of such city or town, a sum of money not exceeding five hundred dollars, for the purpose of providing for the preservation and care of such lots, or its appurtenances, which sum shall be entered upon the books of the treasurer, and held in accordance with the provisions of the ordinances or by-laws of such city or town, in relation to burials.

May pass bylaws for purposes of this SECT. 2. A city or town may pass such ordinances or bylaws, as may be necessary for the purposes of this act and not repugnant to law, and may receive such money for said purposes, and may allow interest thereon, at a rate not exceeding six per cent a year.

#### Chapter 146.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An Act to further amend section eight of chapter twentyfour of the Revised Statutes," as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty-nine, Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, approved February one, eighteen hundred and eighty-seven.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Ch. 9, public laws of 1887, amended. Said above named act is hereby amended, by striking out the four last lines thereof, and insert after the word "settlement" the following, 'and this section shall not be so construed
