PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

Harbor, in the town of Brooklin, erected, or to be erected by license of the selectmen of said Brooklin, in accordance with chapter seventy-eight of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, and acts amendatory thereof, for the purpose of providing a suitable and convenient steamboat landing, and for general freighting business.

SECT. 5. Any incorporator named in section one, may call the first meeting for the purpose of organizing, by giving notice at least seven days before said meeting.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 55.

An Act to incorporate the Round Lake Fish Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. George Cary, James H. Lindsey and all other persons who now are or may hereafter become owners of land upon the shore of Round Lake, in lot three, range nine, in the south division of the town of Littleton, in the county of Aroostook, their heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Round Lake Fish Company, with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to stock said lake with fish and to propagate the same therein, and shall have the exclusive right to take fish therefrom.

Authorized to propagate fish.

SECT. 3. Whoever, without first obtaining the permission of the officers of said corporation, shall in any way take any fish from said lake or kill or injure any fish, or spawn therein, or in any way without such permission fishes in said lake, shall be fined twenty dollars for each offense, to be recovered upon complaint made by any of the officers of said corporation.

Penalty for taking fish unlawfully.

SECT. 4. All fines recovered under this act shall be paid, one-half to said corporation and one-half to the county.

Fines, how disposed of.
