Authorized to

SECT. 8. This corporation shall have the right to erect and maintain piers in said river to protect said bridge from ice or other floating substance.

SECT. 9. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 112.

An Act to authorize the town of Brooks to fund its indebtedness at maturity and to issue new

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Town of Brooks authorized to fund debt. SECT. 1. The town of Brooks is hereby authorized to fund its indebtedness at maturity, and for this purpose to issue bonds, in such form and amount, and with such rates of interest, and payable at such times and in such manner as shall be determined by vote of said town, under a proper article in the warrant at a legal town meeting; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall authorize any increase in the indebtedness of said town.

—authorized to pass votes to carry this act into effect. SECT. 2. To carry into effect the provisions of this act, said town is hereby authorized to pass such votes, as may be deemed necessary and proper, to enter into and make any contract or agreement not inconsistent with the laws of this state.

Sect. 3, This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 113.

An Act to amend section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-four of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and forty-nine, as amended, relating to the Maine Wesleyan Board of Education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 1, ch. 274, Special Laws of 1849, amended. Section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-four of the special laws of eighteen hundred and forty-nine, as amended by chapter four hundred and sixty-two, special laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-two, and chapter fifteen of special laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby amended by striking out after the words "to the value of," the word
