Chapter 191.

An Act to extend the franchise of the Desha Lumber and Planting Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Authorized to construct lines of railroad and telegraph and telephone. SECT. 1. In addition to the powers and privileges already possessed, the Desha Lumber and Planting Company shall have power to construct, maintain and operate a railroad, or railroad telegraph and telephone systems in any state or country, except Maine, in accordance with and subject to all the laws of such state or country.

-to supply water. SECT. 2. Said corporation shall also have power to construct and maintain aqueducts and reservoirs, for the purpose of carrying and supplying fresh water to the inhabitants of any city or town in any state or country except Maine, subject to all the laws of such state or country.

—to conduct a general banking business.

Proviso

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall also have the power to conduct a general banking business in connection with any railroad it may establish, subject to the laws in force where such business may be conducted. But nothing herein shall be construed to give said corporation any banking privileges in the state of Maine, other than those now possessed by said corporation.

Chapter 192.

An 'Act to amend an act entitled "An Act to enable the Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal church in the Diocese of Maine, to remove, rebuild or repair Saint James' Parish Church of Oldtown."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 2, ch. 45, Private Laws of 1881, amended. SECT. 1. Section two of chapter forty-five of the private and special laws of the state of Maine, enacted in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, entitled, "An Act to enable the bishop of the Protestant Episcopal church in the diocese of Maine, to remove, rebuild or repair Saint James' Parish church of Oldtown," is hereby amended by striking out all of said section after the word "act" in the fifth line thereof, and inserting instead of the words thus stricken out, the following, 'may bring appropriate action for the recovery of such loss or damage, and the amount
