Directors may fix tuition in said school.

Springfield Normal School, an institution of learning in said district. Said board may fix the amount of tuition to be charged scholars attending said school, residing beyond the limits of said district; and said district shall be entitled to the same state aid on account of the money so raised by the district and received for tuition, and expended, that it would be entitled to if the same were expended for a free high school. And if an act shall be passed abolishing school districts in towns, said district number three shall be exempted from the provisions of said act.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 216.

An Act to make valid the organization of the Orthodox Congregational Society of Sebago

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The organization of the parish or religious society Doings of SECT. 1. at the village of Sebago lake, in the town of Standish, first society, made valid. called in the proceedings for such organization, the Sebago Lake Congregational Orthodox Society of the town of Standish, on the twenty-second day of May in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, and the doings of said society at a meeting held on the ninth day of June of the same year, in assuming the name of the Orthodox Congregational Society of Sebago Lake, are hereby confirmed and made legal and valid; and said society shall have all the rights and be subject to all the liabilities of parishes and religious societies duly organized under the provisions of chapter twelve of the revised statutes.

This act shall take effect when approved.
