Chapter 284.

An Act to cede to the United States of America, jurisdiction over Widow's Island.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That there be and hereby is ceded to the United States of America, the jurisdiction over Widow's Island, in the county of Knox; provided, however, that this cession of jurisdiction is granted and made upon the express condition, that the Proviso. state of Maine shall retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States, in and over said tracts of land and every portion thereof, so far, that all process, civil or criminal, issuing under the authority of said state, or any officers thereof, may be executed by the proper officers thereof, upon any persons amenable to the same, within the limits and extent of said tracts of land, in like manner and to like effect as if the said jurisdiction had not been ceded.
