CHAP, 2

Copies to be forwarded to Speaker of House and President of Senate of United States. Resolved, That the secretary of state be, and is hereby directed to forward an authenticated copy of the foregoing resolutions, to the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives in Congress assembled, with a request that the same be laid before their respective bodies.

Chapter 2.

Resolve in favor of Peter J. Gabrielle.

Peter J. Gabrielle, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be appropriated to pay Peter J. Gabrielle for services and travel as representative to this legislature, of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Approved February 1, 1887.

Chapter 3.

Resolve in favor of C. H. Porter.

C. II. Porter, in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty-five dollars be paid to C. H. Porter, agent of Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians, to remunerate him for expense incurred in appearing before the committee on Indian affairs.

Approved February 1, 1887.

Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of Henry H. Goss.

Henry H. Goss, in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to Henry H. Goss, lot number forty-five, in township number thirteen, range six, Aroostook county, waiving further settling duties.
