Chapter 359.

An Act to cede to the United States of America, jurisdiction over certain lands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That there be, and hereby is, ceded to the United States of Jurisdiction America, jurisdiction over the following described parcels of land: first, the ledge known and described on page two hun- States. dred and eleven, division A, Atlantic Coast Pilot, second edition, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, as Goose Rocks, surmounted by an iron spindle, wholly submerged at high tide, with an exposed area of two thousand feet at low tide. and being about four hundred yards from the westerly end of Stimpson's island, Knox county, Maine, and second, the rock known and described on page two hundred and eleven, division A, Atlantic Coast Pilot, second edition, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, as a high, bare rock, about threeeighths of a mile from the southerly shore of Stimpson's island, having an area of about sixteen hundred feet, in Knox county, Maine, provided, however, that this cession of juris- -proviso. diction is granted and made upon the express condition that the state of Maine shall retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States, in and over said tracts of land and every portion thereof, so far that all process, civil or criminal, issuing under the authority of said state, or any officers thereof, may be executed by the proper officers thereof, upon any persons amenable to the same, within the limits and extent of said tracts of land, in like manner and to like effect as if the said jurisdiction had not been ceded.

Chapter 360.
