Chapter 471.

An Act additional to Chapter two hundred and forty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-three, to provide for the appointment of a Police Force for the town of Old Orchard.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Selectmen authorized to appoint police and chief of police. SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Old Orchard shall have power and authority to appoint and control a police force and a chief of police. The chief of police, so appointed, shall have all the powers of a constable. The police officers, so appointed, shall severally have all the powers of a constable in criminal matters, within the limits of said town.

May be removed for cause.

- SECT. 2. The selectmen of said town shall have power to remove said police officers and said chief of police whenever they shall deem that the interests of the town require such removal.
 - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 472.

An Act for the protection of fish in Kneeland Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking fish from Kneeland pond, prohibited for four years.

Penalty for violation,

- SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind from Kneeland pond, so called, in the town of Albany, county of Oxford, for the period of four years.
- SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be liable to a fine of not exceeding ten dollars for each offense, and a further fine of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in Oxford county, one-half to the complainant, and one-half to the county of Oxford.
