Chapter 11.

An Act to extend the time for the location and construction of the Maine Shore Line Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The time for the location and construction of the Maine Shore Line Railroad, extending easterly from the town of Hancock is hereby extended four years from the date of approval of this act. Time for location, extended.

SECT. 2. The location of the draw-bridge over Taunton bay shall be determined by the railroad commissioners of the state of Maine, who shall first give a public hearing upon the question of said location to all persons interested, notice of which hearing shall be published in some paper printed in Hancock county, at least ten days prior thereto. Location of draw-bridge, how determined.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 12.

An Act to amend acts relating to a Municipal Court for the city of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section sixteen of chapter six hundred and twenty six of the private and special laws of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-four are hereby amended, by striking out said section and inserting the following section in its stead: 'All fines and penalties received by said clerk except the fees allowed for taxing costs and recording judgments in criminal matters, taking recognizances of persons charged with crime, making and recording libels of liquors seized, and for processes of commitment, shall be accounted for and paid over to the county treasurer, on the first Tuesday of each month, and all fees allowed to said judge by law in criminal cases and received by said clerk, shall be accounted for and paid over by him to the treasurer of the city of Lewiston monthly, and all other fees received by him shall be paid to the persons entitled by law to the same, as if received by a trial justice. If in either case he neglects to Ch. 626, Private Laws of 1874, amended.

—fees, shall be paid to the county treasurer.
