CHAP. 179**Chapter 179.**

An Act to legalize the proceedings by which Highland Plantation was organized.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Proceedings of
Highland
plantation,
legalized.

The proceedings by which Highland plantation in Somerset county, was organized in February eighteen hundred and eighty-six, are hereby confirmed and the organization of said plantation is hereby declared legal and valid.

Approved March 10, 1891.

Chapter 180.

An Act to change the name of Sarah Elizabeth Wasgatt Jordan of Eden.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name changed.

SECT. 1. The name of Sarah Elizabeth Wasgatt Jordan hereby changed to Sarah Elizabeth Wasgatt.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 10, 1891.

Chapter 181.

An Act to change the name of William Ela of Fryeburg.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name changed.

SECT. 1. The name of William Ela of Fryeburg is hereby changed to William Gammon.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 10, 1891.
