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telegraph or telephone upon such terms and conditions as CHAP. 275 may be mutually agreed upon.

SECT. 5. The capital stock of said corporation shall be of such amount as said corporation may, from time to time determine to be necessary but not exceeding the sum of five thousand dollars, for the sole purpose of owning, constructing, maintaining and operating the line or lines of telegraph or telephone hereby authorized and contemplated. And the said corporation may purchase, hold, sell and convey all real estate and personal property necessary for the purposes contemplated in this charter. Capital stock.

SECT. 6. Any two of the incorporators named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written notice signed by both, postage paid, to each of the other corporators, seven days at least before the day of the meeting, naming the time, place and purposes of such meeting, and at such meeting a president, secretary, treasurer and directors may be chosen, by-laws adopted, present amount of capital stock fixed, and any corporate business transacted. First meeting  
how called.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 275.

An Act to prohibit the taking of fish from Sabbath Day Pond in the town of New Gloucester.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from fishing for, or taking fish of any kind, in any manner from Sabbath Day pond in the town of New Gloucester in the county of Cumberland, between the fifteenth day of June and the fifteenth day of May following of each year for the period of five years. Taking of fish

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken in violation hereof, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or municipal or police court in said county of Cumberland, one half to the complainant and one half to said county of Cumberland. Penalty, for  
violation.
