appealed from said court, two dollars. All fines, penalties and costs paid into said court upon convictions and sentences in criminal matters, together with all fees allowed to the judge of said court by law in the transaction of criminal business shall be paid to said clerk. All fines and penalties received by said clerk shall be accounted for and paid over in the same manner as is required by law of trial justices, and all fees allowed to said judge or to said clerk by law in criminal cases and received by said clerk including the trial fee in all cases, shall be accounted for and paid over by him to the treasurer of said city of Waterville quarterly; and all other fees received by him shall be paid to the persons entitled by law to the same as if received by a trial justice.'

SECT. 2. All existing acts, public and private, inconsistent herewith are hereby modified so as to conform to the provisions of this act.

Inconsistent acts, repealed.

SECT. 3. Nothing contained in this act shall be construed to interfere with any actions already commenced, and made returnable before said court, and all said actions shall be entered in said court at the first term thereof, holden after the approval of this act.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 330.

An Act to amend "An Act to provide for the election of a School Committee and a Superintendent of Schools in Bath," approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section four of an act entitled "An Act to provide for the election of a school committee and superintendent of schools in Bath," approved March seventeenth, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows :

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved, and accepted by the city of Bath. The first election of school committee hereunder may be had in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, at a special election to be called and held in

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 331.

An Act to make valid the doings of Penobscot Water and Power Company, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Organization of company, made valid.

SECT. 1. The organization of Penobscot Water and Power Company, a corporation organized under the general laws of the state of Maine, the certificate of organization of which corporation was filed in the office of the secretary of state, on the first day of November, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Authorized to take water from Penobscot river.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized and empowered to take water from Penobscot river sufficient for domestic, sanitary, fire, municipal and all other purposes incidental thereto, including the running of water motors, in the towns of Old Town, Milford, Orono and Veazie, and the city of Brewer, in the county of Penobscot, and also in Old Town, or Indian island.

Authorized to lay pipes.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is authorized to take and convey through said towns and island and to all parts thereof the water of Penobscot river by aqueducts or pipes sunk to any depth desirable for the purpose; and may also take and hold by purchase or otherwise any land necessary for laying and maintaining pipes, aqueducts, hydrants and reservoirs for taking, conducting, holding, discharging and distributing water; and also dig up and excavate any highway and fill the same under the direction and subject to the approval of the municipal officers of the town wherein such highway may be located.

May take and hold real estate.

SECT. 4. Said corporation may take and hold real estate in said city, towns and island by purchase, lease or otherwise as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes contemplated by sections two and three of this act; and if said corporation and the owner or owners of such real estate can-
