**Chapter 58.**

Resolve in favor of the Joint Standing Committee on Military Affairs.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state be directed to pay John Harper, chairman of the joint standing committee on military affairs, the sum of fifty-three dollars and thirty cents, being amount by him paid for expenses of said committee visiting Bath Military Asylum, in accordance with the order of the legislature.

**Chapter 59.**

Resolve in favor of the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum.

*Resolved*, That there be and hereby is appropriated for the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum the sum of eight thousand dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and eight thousand dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two; also the sum of one thousand dollars for repairs for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-one and eighteen hundred and ninety-two. For statement of facts see report of officers of asylum.

**Chapter 60.**

Resolve for appropriation for the repair of ways in Number one, Range two, Somerset County.

*Resolved*, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the repair of the ways in Number one, Range two, known as Pleasant Ridge Plantation, west of the Kennebec river in Somerset county, and that said appropriation be expended under the supervision of the county commissioners of Somerset county.
