brigadier generals and the commanding officers of regiments and battalions, shall appoint their respective staff officers; and all military officers shall be commissoned by the governor.'

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, the selectmen of towns, and the assessors of the several plantations of this state are hereby empowered and directed to notify the voters of their respective cities, towns and plantations in the manner prescribed by law at the meeting in September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to give in their votes upon the amendment proposed in the foregoing resolution; and the question shall be, shall the constitution be amended as proposed by a resolution of the legislature providing that the adjutant general and quarter master general shall be appointed by the governor and the inhabitants of the said cities, towns and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of said amendment expressing it by the word "yes," upon their ballots, and those opposed to the amendment expressing it by the word "no," upon their ballots, and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meeting, and lists of the votes so received shall be made and returned to the secretary of state in the same manner as votes for governor, and the governor and council shall count the same and make return to the legislature; and if a majority of the votes are in favor of said amendment, the constitution shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations, ballots and blank returns in conformity to the foregoing resolves, accompanied with a copy thereof.

Chapter 101.

Resolve in favor of the town of Rockport.

Resolved, That the state librarian be authorized to furnish Town of the town of Rockport with copies of the revised statutes, of favor of. the acts and resolves of eighteen hundred and eighty-five. eighteen hundred and eighty-seven and eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and of such Maine reports and their accompany-

Chapter 102.

Resolve directing the Superintendent of Public Buildings to hang certain doors in the State House, so that the same shall swing outward.

Resolved, That the superintendent of public buildings, be, and he is hereby directed, immediately after this legislature finally adjourns, to proceed to hang certain doors in the state house, so that the same shall swing outward, in compliance with section twenty-five of chapter twenty-eight of the revised statutes.

Chapter 103.

Resolve establishing a Valuation of the State of Maine.

Resolved, That the number of polls and the amount of the estates annexed to the several cities, towns and plantations in the several counties within this state, and the list of wild lands, and of timber and grass on reserved lands not included in the lists of cities, towns and plantations, with the number of acres and the value thereof, thereto annexed, and the aggregate of the several counties, as contained in the schedules hereunto annexed, are hereby taken and established as the true number of polls, and the valuation of estates, and the same are hereby taken and constituted a general valuation for the purposes of taxation as provided by section seven of article nine of the constitution of this state.

This resolve shall take effect when approved.
